What is Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)?

Many products found in the home may be considered HHW because they contain hazardous materials that are harmful to some people, animals and the environment. Unused portions of these products are referred to as household hazardous waste.



HHW Disposal

The majority of this hazardous waste ends up in landfills where it has the potential to pollute our ground water and drinking water resources.

A partnership between the local governments and private enterprises in your area created permanent waste collection sites in hopes that these wastes are no longer landfilled, illegally dumped, or burned. Please use the sites listed on back panel, but follow the facility instructions so that we can keep these sites open for safe recycling.

- Only household quantities will be accepted at no charge.
- Commercially generate products will not be accepted.
- Unknown materials cannot be accepted!
- Do not eat, smoke or drink while visiting the collection site.
- Do not mix or blend various paints together.
- Do not leave materials after operating hours.
- Do not use the facility without checking in with the facility operator.

Examples of HHW

Automotive Products: Motor oils, oil filters, brake and transmission fluids, antifreeze, lead-acid batteries, etc.

Swimming Pool Chemicals: Chlorine, etc.

Fluorescent Light Bulbs: Long, thin, tube-like bulbs.

Paint Products: Oil-based and latex paints, stains, shellacs, lacquer, varnish, turpentine, spray paint, paint thinners, and paint strippers.

Lawn & Garden Products: Over-the-counter household pesticides, insecticides and herbicides.

Batteries: Dry cell household batteries, button batteries and motor batteries.

Cleaning Products: Any household cleaning product containing harmful chemicals, including bleach and ammonia.

Sharps: Used medical needles delivered in heavy, plastic containers. Bleach or detergent bottles work well. Soda bottles and milk jugs are not adequate storage containers.

You can also bring in TV's and computers to be recycled.

If you are still not sure if a product is hazardous, there are many key words on products packaging to let you know the material inside is hazardous. Look for words like *Flammable, Explosive, Corrosive, Caustic, Toxic, Poisonous, Radioactive, and Infectious.*

Transporting HHW

When bringing products to the disposal facility protect yourself by taking these precautions.

- It is suggested that you wear safety goggles and gloves when handling HHW.
- Bring products in their original container.
- If the product container is deteriorating and/or leaking, place the entire container in another container and include the original label if possible. Clearly label the outside container.
- Securely package products before transporting to prevent spills.
- Always transport HHW products in your vehicle trunk or truck bed. Never transport HHW in the passenger compartment of your vehicle.



Doing Your Part!!!!

REDUCE- Taking HHW to a collection facility helps reduce the toxicity of the waste found in area landfills and helps protect waste haulers from harm.

REUSE- Each HHW collection site provides a reuse area where select items will be made available to our visitors to have for personal use. Looking for a product? Look here!

RECYCLE- When reuse is not an option, some products can be recycled. Materials that must be disposed will be handled in the safest possible manner.
